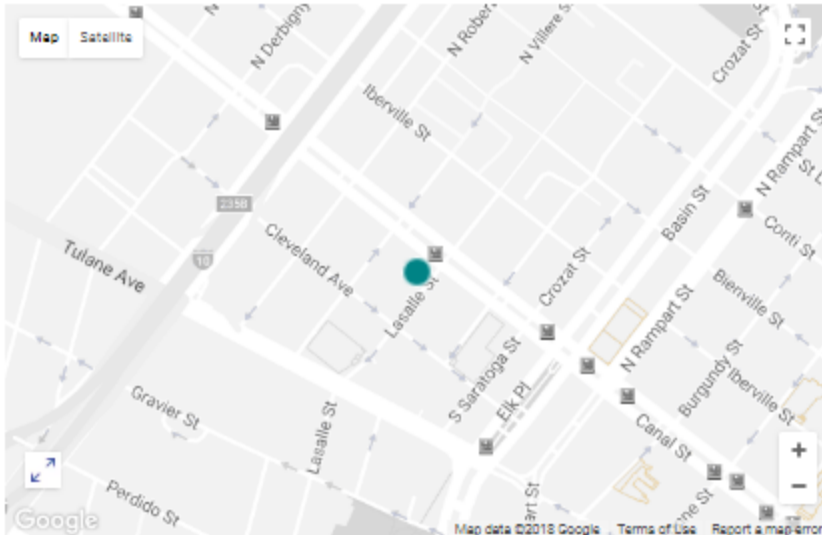

7/10 Location

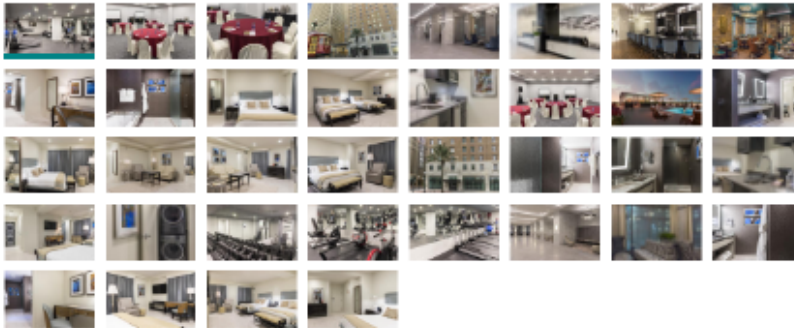
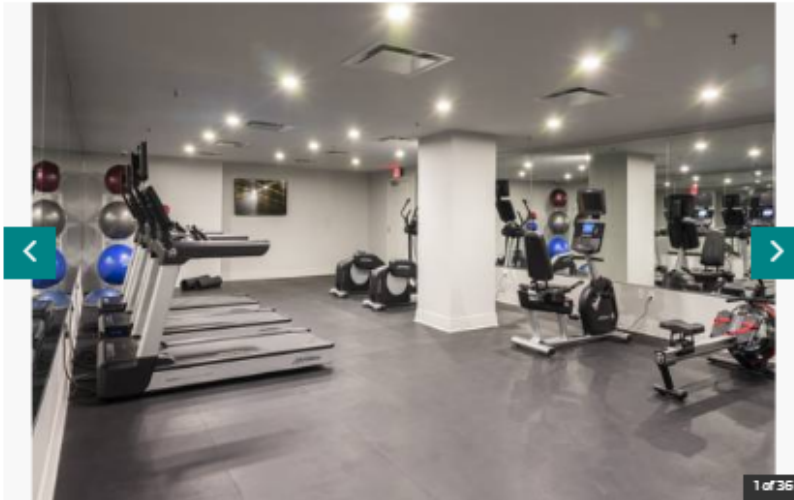
Just slightly away from the main action on Canal Street, but some guests will think this a boon, and the surrounding neighbourhood is catching up fast. The streetcar passes right outside the hotel, making public transport a breeze, and the French Quarter is easily walkable.

Style & character

The hotel inhabits a whole city block, and as such is an imposing affair. The attention to detail holds firm though, even down to the near-subliminal symmetry of the marble cuts in the regally shining lobby. Chic grey furniture and chandeliers that nod to Art Deco line the public spaces, with dozens of comfy nooks peppering the corridors. A few original details remain, including a beautiful marble staircase off the main lobby and vintage-looking lifts. Huge modern art pieces by local talent give this old soldier a trendy, modern swagger.

Service & facilities

The front desk staff are bright-eyed and bushy-tailed, which brings a welcome breath of enthusiasm and friendliness. A sixth-floor pool deck (the pool heats up in winter and has controlled cooling in summer) with expansive lounging area and covered bar area (what a treat in those New Orleans' Augusts) are soon to be joined by a full-service spa, and there's a fitness centre. Live jazz is scheduled to greet guests in the evenings in the near future and various retail outlets will soon populate the ground floor.

Rooms

Deluxe King rooms come in a mix of contemporary colours, with greys, whites and yellows blending harmoniously to give the place an effortless, timeless air. There are clever design touches that stand out – the hidden safe in a desk drawer and power points that are equally discreet. The wardrobe and drawers have modern, push-to-open fittings, and the highly polished wood patterns on the desk make for a chic design choice. The shower is a large walk-in affair, with the controls sensibly positioned away from the water stream. The hotel's own-branded toiletries complete the picture.

Food & drink

At the time of writing, the food and beverage offerings were still being rolled out. There's a modern lobby bar and the restaurant is a symphony in blues and paisley patterns that look striking, but the service was restricted to a (complimentary) continental breakfast of pastries, fruits and yogurt, with lunch and dinner services to follow soon. The poolside bar was similarly still in the works, as was an on-site coffee shop.

Value for money

Double rooms from \$139 (£105) in low season; and from \$439 (£315) in high. Continental breakfast included. Free Wi-Fi.

Access for guests with disabilities?

The hotel has 10 ADA-compliant rooms with widened doors, accessible bathrooms and visual alarms.

Family-friendly?

The pool area looks child-friendly, and the downtown location is an ideal base for exploration.

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
